THE ROSARY

October is the special month of the Rosary. The Rosary is dedicated to our Virgin Mary who is known to be the mother of Jesus Christ. The Rosary is said to remind us about the purpose of why Mary was chosen to be the mother of Jesus, and why we respect the Christian Faith. In the Rosary, we say three main prayers, the Our Father, Hail Mary and the Glory Be. Year 6 has recently used the 4C's to gather information that we already knew about the Rosary. We also created questions linked to what we wanted to know.

Each day during the month of October, the Junior Joeys lead our school community in saying part of the Rosary.

What we already know about the Rosary!

Since the month of the Rosary has arrived, Year 6 discussed as a group, what we already knew about the Rosary. Here are some facts about what we know.

When and where do we pray the Rosary?

We can say the Rosary in our own time or anywhere we want, but October is the special month of the Rosary as it is dedicated to Mary the mother of God.

What is the true meaning of the Hail Mary?

People say the Hail Mary but they don't know what the prayer means. Year 6 discussed in Communication groups, the true meaning of the Hail Mary.

"Hail Mary full of grace", this means, "hello Mary, you are full of faith." This was a greeting from the Angel Gabriel.

"The Lord is with you", this means that God is always going to be there for you.

"Blessed are you among women", this means that Mary is the most special lady out of all the women in the world because she was the chosen one to carry Jesus in her womb.

"And blessed is the fruit of thy womb", this means that the baby in her womb, Jesus, will be blessed by his father.

Q: Does the Rosary help us with our everyday life?


