<u>NAPLAN</u>

All student in Year 3 and 5 will complete the NAPLAN tests next week.

The Tests will begin on Tuesday the 9th of May and finish on Thursday the 11th of May. It is important that all children are at school on these days and on time. NAPLAN can be stressful for our students, so we ask parents not to over emphasise the importance of this test. The children need to view this as they would any other school day and do the best they can as they would with any class assessment. If you have any questions or concerns, please speak with the class teachers. We wish our students a positive learning experience.

Teachers Professional Learning

As a staff, analysing student performance and establishing learning goals for our students and ourselves is part of what we do on a daily basis. Teachers identify learning needs for individual students as well as learning trends for our school. This determines what our school focus will be for the year or as part of a five year plan. The last few years we have concentrated on

developing oral language for every student. It is important that students are able to articulate what they are learning and what they need to do to be better learners.

In order to provide the best education possible for our students teachers have spent many hours perfecting our teaching. Next week the teachers will begin another course of study on Multiplicative Thinking. This course of study runs after school hours and will focus on improving how we teach multiplication and division strategies.

Our focus over the last two years has been very precise and based on student need derived from data analysis. The hard work is paying off with noticeable improvements in the way students are learning and how they see themselves as learners. I wish to thank the teachers for their hard work and dedication to the students in their care.

LEARNING MATTERS FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL In time for NAPLAN week...

To Our Dearest Students from Year 3,

Next week you will sit your first NAPLAN test. Before you take this test there is something very important for you to know:

This test does not assess all of what makes each of you exceptional and unique.

The people who score these tests don't know that some of you love to sing, are good at drawing or can teach others how to use a computer program. They have not seen the way that some of you can dance with grace or speak confidently to a large group. They do not know that your friends count on you to be there for them when they are sad. They do not know that you participate in sports, help your Mum and Dad or that play with your little brother, sister or cousins. They do not know that you are caring, thoughtful and that every day you do your best. Because these attributes cannot be tested.

The scores you get from this test will tell you how you did on that day, but they will not tell you everything. They can't tell you that you have improved on something that you once found difficult. They can't tell you that you brighten up your teacher's day. They can't tell you how amazingly special you are.

So come to school ready to do your best for the NAPLAN test and remember there is no one way to 'test' all of the wonderful things that make you, YOU!

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

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School Banking

A school banking service is available to students who hold Commonwealth Dollarmites or Youth Saver accounts. Encouraging children to make small regular deposits to a bank account helps them to develop good savings

habits and awareness of the value of money. Students who wish to deposit money should bring bank books (with the deposit slip filled in) and money to school on Tuesday morning. The deposits are processed on Tuesday

during the morning and the bank books returned to students by their class teacher. Please note that we are

unable to process cheques. For every deposit you make, you will receive a token. When you receive 10 tokens you can redeem them for a prize.

Any parent wishing to open a Commonwealth account for their child may collect an information package from the school office.

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
