HOLY FAMILY'S LEARN TO SWIM PROGRAM - TERM 4

Holy Family's swimming program will be held in Weeks 7 & 8 from Monday 7th November to Wednesday 26th November. The cost for the program includes 8 lessons with a specialised swimming teacher in a small group, pool entry and bus fare to and from the pool. The cost for 2014 is **\$75** per child.

The swimming permission note and payment slip went home last term. All payments are due by Friday 31st October. A reminder the Student Survey that is attached needs to be completed for each child in your family attending the swimming program.
