Message from the Principal

Welcome back as we begin Term 4 for 2016. It seems only yesterday that I was welcoming our families to the start of the new year. I am always surprised how quickly time passes and how busy our days become when the school term begins. This term is another busy term, filled with many learning opportunities for the students and teachers. The gymnastics and swimming program and our Swimming Carnival will also take place this term. Also for our parents, to name some of the events happening this term, you will have the opportunity to participate in our Parent Learning walk, attend a student led conference with your child and celebrate the 75th Anniversary of our Parish on the 20th of November. A term calendar went home to parents on the last week of school and a copy will be on our website this week.

At the beginning of every term it is a good idea to place in our newsletter a few important reminders to ensure all our families are aware of school policy, procedures and expectations.

If your child has any concerns or issues at school, parents must speak with the class teacher first. It is likely that the class teacher is already aware of the issue and has addressed it with the students involved. I ask that parents do not approach students and attempt to handle any situation between your child and other students.

- Attendance at school is paramount. Children must attend school everyday unless they are unwell. A note must accompany your child explaining the reason for their absence from school when they return.
- School begins at 8.50am. It is important that children arrive before or at this time. Lateness adds unneeded stress on your child.
- Morning playground supervision begins at 8.15am. Please ensure children are not left at the locked gate before this time as it is unsafe. Please see the office if you would like information about the local child care services.
- Lost property is a growing problem at Holy Family. Please label your child's clothing and property.
- Our school gates will open at 3.00 each afternoon. We ask that parents do not arrive on the school premise before this time. This is an issue of student safety.
- Meeting with your child's teacher is an important part of our role. In order for the teacher to give you the respect and time, all meetings need to be by appointment. Parents are not to engage in a discussion with teachers during morning assembly or at the door during afternoon dismissal. The teacher has a duty of care to the children present and distraction from this may lead to a safety issue.

Working together as a team parents, teachers and students is an important part of our faith community. In my many years in education, the majority of problems can be solved calmly with a single conversation. It is important to understand that teachers only want what is best for your child. Children will share their concerns and feeling with their parents and it is important that parents discuss these issues with teachers in a respectful and calm manner. Aggression will not be tolerated at Holy Family. We must always model to our children the Gospel values of our Lord.

School should be a fun place to go. It is important that our children are motivated to come and learn and build relationships with others. Questions you can ask your children at the end of a school day are, Tell me one great thing you learnt today? What are you looking forward to tomorrow? Engaging in positive conversations will encourage a positive mindset to school.
