#### **Scripture Reflection**

We are at the stage of the year where lots of winter sports such as football, netball, rugby league and AFL are beginning. As well as dancing, music and other things that our busy kids get up to. These all require a lot of commitment from parents to get to training and lessons during the week then games and performances on the weekend. We make sure that they don't miss out on any of these important times. Rarely, do you hear 'We're too busy to go to your game this week' or 'I haven't got time to get you to training.'

This Sunday's readings are all about faith. In the beautiful Gospel from John, Jesus tells us "I am the resurrection and the life. Any family having difficulty in paying must make an appointment with Mrs Guilfoyle to discuss this matter. Thank you.


# Country
