#### Principal's Message

Next week the students in Year 3 and 5 will sit the NAPLAN tests in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions and Numeracy. The tests will be administered over three days, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

The NAPLAN tests are designed to assess the skills of Australian students in Literacy and Numeracy. The tests provide data on the achievements of students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 for reporting to parents/carers and schools and for systematic reporting.

Although there always seems to be a great deal of controversy about the purpose of NAPLAN, the results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. The analysis of trend data also guides our schools implementation plan each year so that areas of improvement are addressed in a timely manner and tracked to ensure improvement in these targeted areas occurs.

Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard. The detailed report also provides parents with an overview of strengths and challenges for their child in the test domains.

Parents can view school NAPLAN results for previous years on the Government 'myschools' website.

It is important that we encourage our children to do their best, however, we do not place added stress of unrealistic expectations on our children. It is after all, one test on one day and as teachers, we administer a variety of diagnostic and teacher made test to track student learning.

If you have any questions regarding the NAPLAN test please make an appointment to discuss this with your child's teacher.

#### **Biennial Catholic Schools Parent Conference**
