
Grandparents Day

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
In Need of Prayers

Attendance



As we begin a new term I urge all parents to make a conscientious effort to get their children to school each day and on time. Looking at the above timetable you are able to see that in our first week back at school we were still below the diocesan average. Children get sick and we know they are unable to attend school but otherwise children need to be at school everyday to maximise their learning experiences. Towards the end of Term 2 I have noticed an increase in the number of families applying for leave. In a few extreme cases this is unavoidable however if you want to take your child on holidays it needs to be done during the allotted school holidays. Another noticing is that there are about 30 students who are consistently late each morning, times ranging from 10mins per day to up to 40mins daily. If this is



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added up at 10mins late each day that 50mins per week. At 40mins a day over a week is 200mins or 3 hours and 20 mins, basically half a day a week those children are missing out on learning. How much LEARNING TIME is your child missing? What impact is this having on their academic and social growth?

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
ACARA Collection Student Background Data Notice:


