Last Wednesday, Mrs Tracey DiGiuseppe (Business Manager) and myself attended a presentation at Guildford Leagues Club for the 2019 Clubs for Cumberland ClubsGRANTS Scheme. 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




We travelled to our motel for overnight. That was it for Day 1.


