
In addition to this, we have been learning about this parable using the three senses approach to Religious Education. The three senses approach to Religious Education features the Literal, Spiritual and Application senses.

Partnership involves parents, families and teachers working together to benefit children. Each recognises, respects and values what the other does and says. Partnership involves responsibility on both sides.



#### Attendance

School attendance plays a critical role in enhancing the lives of students in schools. Every day of attendance adds to a student's achievement and success at school. Schools in partnership with parents are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students.

Parents are required to send in a signed note explaining the reason for their child's absence when the child returns to school.

#### **Parking**

Parking remains an issue around Holy Family. In the interest of student safety, the Hudson Street car park is for staff use only and is closed between 9:00 am & 3:00 pm each day. Parents and friends visiting the school during school hours must enter through the unlocked pedestrian gate near the office. This gate is to remain closed at all times.

As a courtesy to others and to our neighbours, when dropping children off at school or picking them up, parents are asked not to park across driveways. Parents are not to park in the Presbytery driveway at anytime.



Outside the main gates is a designated Disabled Parking space which unfortunately is being used by parent and carers who are not legally permitted to park here. This is effecting one of our families who do have a 'disabled parking permit' and are finding it extremely frustrating that members of our community are not obeying road rules. What message are parents giving their children by parking illegally?

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
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Parents are also to assist children in observing road rules by using the designated children crossing rather than jay-walking across the road amongst the traffic. Student safety is our first priority.

#### **Environment Incursion**

This year the teachers of Holy Family have decided to start some initiatives to solve the playground littering problem and to reduce the amount of rubbish that is created in our school. It is our goal to improve students' awareness and understanding of the impacts of our waste on the environment and to enable them to take actions that protect the environment in our school and at home. During the first weeks of this term all grades have learnt about recycling waste as part of their science and literacy learning. Some grades have participated in an incursion on Thursday of Week 3. In the lesson that was held by a specialist Environment Educator from Cumberland Council students learnt about rubbish that goes into landfills, recyclable waste, compost and garden waste.

Year 2 and Year 4 have participated in a rubbish sorting activity where they separated the rubbish from our school into categories of recyclable rubbish and rubbish that goes to a landfill.
