We are welcomed by many different people in many different ways. We can also welcome others in many ways.




We are currently working on our end product - a video for the Kindergarten students of Holy Family Primary School for 2021! Be sure to check out our facebook page early next term to view these end products!

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
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From the Principal...

Dear Parents and Friends,



As we complete another very busy term I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Kindergarten and Year 2, who on Monday and Tuesday led the school in two different prayer experiences. While both grades drew the community into prayer with them, what struck me was that both focused on the concept that we are the Body of Christ on Earth, in the here and now.

These children, in their smiles, their interactions with their peers and teachers, their focus on learning, their enthusiasm and curiosity reflect the love of Jesus throughout our school community. Our faith and belief in the living Jesus is at the core of who we are, a Catholic community at Holy Family.

In the year that Australian Catholic Schools celebrate 200 Years of Catholic Education, another concept that Year 2 focused on, I'd like to share with you an adapted version of what a Principal colleague shared with his school community.

The following passage is adapted from the National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC) which was established by the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference through the Bishops Commission for Catholic Education (Chairperson Most Rev Anthony Fisher OP).

Why do we have Catholic Schools?

Holy Family Primary School contributes to the Parish's mission to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ, offering the Catholic community of Granville an educational foundation for life to the full, meaning the full development of the students - intellectually, spiritually, physically, morally and emotionally. Holy Family fulfils parents' rights in a democratic, free society to choose the schooling for their children which reflects their own values, beliefs and hopes as Australians.

Who Catholic Schools are for?

Holy Family Primary School is for children who, through baptism, have a right to an education in the Catholic faith in a Catholic school. In addition, Holy Family supports parents and guardians who wish to entrust their children's future because of their explicit goals and acknowledged educational quality.

What is distinctive about Catholic Schools?

Holy Family Primary School promotes a particular view of the person, the community, the nation and the world, centred on the person and teachings of Jesus Christ. It challenges students to find, through God, meaning and value in their lives. Holy Family forms an integral part of our church community in which all generations live, worship and



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grow together in Granville. In critiquing our culture, and challenging community values, as an integral part of their Gospel mission, Holy Family aims to be a welcoming and reflective community whose most distinctive sign is the discernment of God's presence in its spiritual life. We promote values which unite Australia by promoting a citizenship infused by a commitment to social justice and encouraging students to develop an international perspective of their own country and how their country can identify and respond justly to its international obligations. Holy Family develops a sense of historical perspective by reflecting on the development of societies and cultures over time, a story of human frailty but of continual efforts to live the Gospel message, giving priority to educating the spiritually and financially poor and being their advocates.

During this time of COVID and our inability to gather, we must always reflect on our relationships with each other and with our God using the lens of our saviour Jesus Christ.

Update from CEDP on the Draft New Curriculum for Religious Education

Thank you for your interest in learning more about our new approach to Religious Education. As every parent would expect, this will be age appropriate for children and young people. Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta is looking forward to sharing an updated version of our Draft New Curriculum with parents and carers in early October. NEW Online Platform!

The Diocese of Parramatta recently launched The Well – a new online platform that provides free, 'on-demand' inspiration for families, children, young people and faith communities. With over 80 (and growing) videos, podcasts and other online resources, at any time of day or night, you can watch and listen to:

- High-energy children's shows
- Information and reflections on the sacraments
- Recordings of young musicians around the Diocese leading praise and worship
- Thought-provoking discussions from local and international speakers
- Inspirational sharing from young people and young women.

School Uniform Update

In the very near future Holy Family will be changing our uniform supplier from Joseph's Uniforms in Guildford to Oz Fashion, Granville. CEDP is streamlining the number of uniform suppliers across the diocese. Oz Fashion was chosen because of the quality product they supply, value for money, location and the owners support of the catholic community of Granville and the diocese. You may still purchase uniform items from Joseph's at the moment, although some parents have informed me that they were unable to purchase boys summer shirts (sizes 8 or 10). As soon as Oz Fashion officially takes over I will immediately notify the community.

When we return to school in Term 4 children will wear their full summer uniform. All uniforms must be worn neatly and correctly, including the correct socks. Our school rule—No Hat No Play requires students to wear our school hat when outside. These hats are available to purchase at the school office.

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


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New Signage

Swimming Program

Due to continuing Covid-19 restrictions we have decided to cancel the 2020 swimming program scheduled for Term 4. Early Term 4 we will be sending a survey home about the swimming program asking for parent feedback.

Privacy Act

A number of parents have contacted the school and expressed their anger that their contact details have been used to be part of a group chat without their consent. I do not know who was responsible for this but it is a breach of confidentiality and privacy. This is not acceptable. I would encourage any members of the parent community who may know who was responsible to speak to the parent or parents and ask them not to do this again.

Sick Leave & Documentation

We ask all our families to follow the guidelines below as we value the well-being and health of the Holy Family

- Currently, no student should attend school if they are unwell (Doctor's Certificate).
- Each student who is absent from school or who has been sent home because they have flu-like symptoms, need to see a doctor or must have a COVID-19 test.
- A negative COVID-19 test result must be provided to the school before a student can come back to school. The notification can be a NSW Health or COVID-19 Testing Centre letter, SMS or email and / or a medical certificate.
- Students are not able to return to school until they return a negative COVID-19 result and are symptom free. Doctor's Medical Certificates. We ask that when submitting a skoolbag absentee online for a child that is absent, and a medical certificate has been obtained from the doctor, please forward this certificate to the school email HolyFamilyEGranville@parra.catholic.edu.au

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Student Data Validation

As part of our annual system and legal requirements, Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) is asking families to ensure all relevant contact and student information is up to date and accurate for the purposes of communication and providing relevant support to students.

On Monday 19 October, households will receive an email or SMS from CEDP with a link and login details to the Student Data Validation (SDV) form.

Once you have logged in you will be able to verify existing information from the school database and update if necessary. The process should not take more than 15 minutes and will need to be completed by 5:00pm on Friday 6 November.

In our peer support lessons we discussed the importance of challenging ourselves.






When there is something you really want to do you need to work hard and try hard.
