

We often hear our students say 'It's not fair!' in our classroom and on our playgrounds.


This week our students learnt about the importance of sharing materials, games at recess, or how much time a teacher spends with a student.

Our students reflected on times they have demonstrated fairness and created bookmarks to take with them into 2021!


